Campsite Reservation

Here's how to use Sportsmen's Centennial Park Campsite Reservation System 2023 Season

McLean County's Sportsmen's Centennial Park has 97 campsites, including 54 electrical sites and it is usually easy to find a good camping site within the park.

Sportsmen's Centennial Park campsites may be reserved online at https://app.fireflyreservations.com/Reserve/Property/SportsmensCentennialPark.

All of the campsites at our park are subject to reservations, with the exception of the sites that are included in our long term camping. **We recommend reservations be made in advance of your visit.** Camping fees will be \$25/night for an electrical site and \$15/night for a non-electrical site.

All campers coming on a site available basis must pay immediately after selecting a camp site. All reserved sites should be posted but <u>campers without reservations MUST check with park personnel before setting up at a vacant site</u>. This is to insure that they are not in a reserved area, should the reserved sign be missing. All long time sites will have RED site markers.

Check-out time for campers is 4:00 PM. You may request an extension of up to two hours if needed. Also early check-in is permissible if the site is available. Check with park personnel.

Holiday reservations require a full non-refundable payment upon making the reservation.

U. S. Army Corps of Engineers require gatherings of over 30 people require approval of special event form. Contact park personnel for details.
