McLean County Commission Proceedings Tuesday, October 20, 2020

The final October meeting of the Board of Commissioners was called to order at 8:32 a.m. by Chairperson Steve Cottingham. Present were Commissioners Cottingham, Steve Lee, and Barry Suydam. Also present was DES Manager Noelle Kroll, Chief Deputy Sheriff Richard Johnson, Auditor Beth A. Knutson, Deputy Auditor Nancy Leidholm, and Ralph Mancini of BHG News Services.

Moved by Lee, seconded by Suydam, to approve minutes from the previous meeting and Special Meeting as presented. All voted aye.

Highway Superintendent Jim Grey along with Wold Engineering representative Mike Rivinius joined the meeting. Grey reported that crews were hoping to finish up mowing today or tomorrow because of the snow. Crews had the trucks and plows ready yesterday in case they were needed today. Grey reported that Sundre Sand and Gravel is moving their crusher into the Johnson gravel pit today. Discussion followed with Lee and Grey determining that all available gravel should be crushed now as it would be hard to get someone in to finish off the last 15,000 tons. Grey stated that Sundre Sand and Gravel is alright with the county paying a portion for the gravel this year and next year.

Grey submitted the Road Maintenance Agreement from Garrison Diversion for road work along the area for the new raw water intake caisson and pump station and appurtenances for the Red River Valley Water Supply Project south of Washburn. He stated that Garrison Diversion will be responsible for what gets done during the construction of the project and once completed, the road will go back to being a low maintenance road as before. The road is flat with no ditches. Cottingham questioned if water would be a problem with Grey answering no.

Moved by Lee, seconded by Suydam, to approve the Road Maintenance Agreement with Garrison Diversion. Roll Call Vote: Aye: Suydam, Lee, and Cottingham. Nay: None. Motion Carried.

Grey and Rivinius discussed various road projects to consider for the 2021 road construction season. A request from residents at the October 6, 2020, meeting for repairs and paving on a portion of 50th Avenue NW was discussed with Rivinius reporting that paving the road would cost an estimated \$900,000.00 per mile. Knutson stated that the request was for a five-mile portion of the road. Lee stated that generally in the past when the county has done new asphalt it has been done with significant federal funding. This isn't a feasible project for the county to take on. Suydam would like to see the first two miles of the gravel road upgraded with Rivinius estimating \$50,000.00 per mile. Rivinius stated that in order to build up the road right-of-way will likely need to be purchased. Lee feels the only feasible approach is to upgrade the gravel road. Rivinius will put some numbers together for an upcoming meeting.

Maintenance Supervisor Curt Malo joined the meeting.

Rivinius presented an estimate of \$1,300,000.00 for road improvements to raise County Road 4 above the high-water mark. He recommended getting started on the project as soon as possible as wetland mitigation, if needed, will take time and money as well. He stated that if federal aid isn't used, mitigation may not have to be done. Cottingham stated that conditions are about as good as they've been to get this project done. Lee is concerned with using the entire budget for one project and requested that Grey submit an updated ten-year road project list for the commission's review. Cottingham suggested Rivinius track down what is needed for mitigation. Grey and Rivinius will return to the next commission meeting with their findings.

Suydam discussed pavement on County Road 9. Grey stated that crews will patch the holes the best they can this year stating that mill and overlay on the 6-7 miles would be up there in price.

DES Manager Noelle Kroll was present to inform the commission that because of the county's COVID-19 risk level status being raised to orange, she will ask the state for an extension to do the full-scale active shooter exercise previously scheduled to be held at the courthouse on November 12.

Chief Deputy Sheriff Richard Johnson was present to request approval of a financing agreement through Motorolla for the SIRN project for equipment and upgrades for the state required communications system. This includes the dispatch radio project and patrol car radios. Knutson feels it's a good option in case we need it. Johnson also presented the Notice to Proceed to be signed for the state.

Moved by Lee, seconded by Suydam, to approve the financing agreement with Motorolla along with the Notice to Proceed acknowledging that the county wishes to be included with group 3. Roll Call Vote: Aye: Suydam, Lee, and Cottingham. Nay: None. Motion Carried.

The Chairperson recessed at 9:06 a.m.

Chairperson Cottingham reconvened the meeting at 9:10 a.m. and immediately opened a public hearing for approval of the Special Assessment Commission's recommendations for assessing the Lakeview Estates Street Improvement District 1-2020 Patching and Chip Seal Project by assessing the properties by lot. Knutson stated that she'd received no written testimony for or against the recommendation and presented the assessment list. Cottingham feels that most residents understand how it's being done and is willing to move forward with the recommendation.

Moved by Lee, seconded by Suydam, to approve the special assessment values as follows:

WHEREAS, this governing body has previously reviewed the Assessment List and has heard and determined the appeals filed by the persons aggrieved by the determination of the Special Assessment Commission as set forth on Exhibit A attached hereto at the County's October 21, 2020, meeting.

NOW, THEREOFRE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. That the Assessment List as attached hereto and marked Exhibit C is hereby in all things approved and confirmed.
- 2. That the County Auditor is hereby directed to forthwith certify the Assessment List noted as Exhibit C and file the same in the office of the County Auditor.
- 3. That said special assessments unpaid shall bear and accrue interest at the rate of 2% per annum above the rate on the Bonds (.97%). The special assessments shall bear and accrue interest from October 1, 2020 and shall be certified and payable in equal annual installments over a period of 5 years, with the first certification in 2021 for collection in 2021 and annually thereafter.
- 4. That the County Auditor is hereby directed to annually certify said special assessment installments with interest as above specified for extension on the tax lists of the County as required by law.

The Chairperson closed the public hearing at 9:14 a.m.

Land Use Administrator Todd Schreiner, and NDSU County Agents Calandria Jarboe and Courtney Hoikkala joined the meeting.

The rearrangement of county offices was discussed. Malo stated that a contractor is coming this week to provide an estimate on moving the doorway in the Dakota Central Social Services area. Knutson recommended waiting on the estimates to see what the costs are before making any decisions. Lee doesn't want to dive into anything until comfortable with what's being done.

Malo presented a bid from H. A. Thompson & Sons for repairs for the air handler at the Law Enforcement Center but requested holding off on a decision until another bid is received. Discussion followed.

Malo informed the commission that he'd ordered a pump for about \$700.00 for the circulation system for hot water in the courthouse. Discussion followed.

Knutson told the commission that there are 13 parcels taken for 2017 taxes remaining for the November tax sale.

Knutson updated the commission regarding the election and the county's COVID-19 status stating that a handful of election workers have opted to not work at the polling sites on Election Day. Discussion followed with Cottingham recommending a priority list be set regarding the polling sites. The commission determined that the White Shield/Ziegler Precinct will remain open. If the number of workers keeps dropping, the vote centers will close in the order of Turtle Lake Vote Center first, followed by Washburn Vote Center, in order to be able to keep a fully staffed vote center in Garrison.
