McLean County Commission Proceedings Tuesday, December 19, 2017

The final regular December meeting of the Board of Commissioners was called to order at 8:29 a.m. by Chairperson Barry Suydam. Present were Commissioners Suydam, Steve Lee, and Doug Krebsbach. Also present were Auditor Les Korgel, Deputy Auditor Nancy Leidholm, along with Alyssa Adams of BHG News Services.

Moved by Krebsbach, seconded by Lee, to approve the minutes of the previous meeting as submitted. Roll Call Vote: Aye: Lee, Krebsbach, and Suydam. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Korgel presented a County Deed for signing from McLean County to the City of Washburn for land acquired through tax deed proceedings for land described as the southerly twenty-nine (29') of Lot Eight (8) of the G. C. Hoffman Addition to the City of Washburn, North Dakota, for the sum of \$1.

Highway Superintendent Jim Grey joined the meeting to report on department activities. He informed the commission that Mike Green of Washburn has been hired to fill the Shop Mechanic position. Crews are busy chasing washboard and trimming trees. Discussion followed regarding the possible winter storm approaching and Grey stated that the plow trucks will be ready to go if necessary.

Disaster Emergency Services Director Noelle Kroll joined the meeting to present bids for a full-scale regional hazmat exercise. Bids were received from Heartland Consulting Group, LLC of Bismarck in the amount of \$5,800.00 and J. A. K. of Minot in the amount of \$5,095.20. The county has been awarded the Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness Grant (HMEP) at an 80/20 match for a full scale exercise to include all county fire departments and ambulance services as well as the Sheriff's Department and hazmat teams out of Minot and Bismarck.

Moved by Lee, seconded by Krebsbach, to accept the bid from J. A. K. of Minot in the amount of \$5,095.20 for a full-scale hazardous materials exercise. Roll Call Vote: Aye: Lee, Krebsbach, and Suydam. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Korgel presented a letter from Lewis & Clark Regional Development Council concerning an amendment to the Regional Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program Statement.

Korgel then presented a letter from the North Dakota Department of Health in regards to the City of Coleharbor's unpermitted dumpsite.

States Attorney Ladd Erickson joined the meeting to discuss a mowing policy and Malcolm Township. This being in Lee's district, he will visit with Erickson about this at a later date.

Discussion about township meetings was held.

Moved by Krebsbach, seconded by Lee, to approve the township meeting schedule for January 4 and 5, 2018 as presented. Roll Call Vote: Aye: Lee, Krebsbach, and Suydam. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Korgel discussed the changes with how the budgets need to be submitted this year and would like to consider holding an evening meeting in early April with the county entities to explain the changes.

Moved by Lee, seconded by Krebsbach, to set the Preliminary Budget meeting for September 18, 2018 at 11:00 a.m. Roll Call Vote: Aye: Lee, Krebsbach, and Suydam. Nay: None. Motion carried.

Clerk of Court Cathy Bailey joined the meeting to discuss the Court Facilities Improvement Grant (CFIG). She presented a bid from Cyndie Perkerewicz of Washburn to strip, sand and refinish the benches in the courtroom for the total amount of \$1,500.00. Bailey submitted a quote from Rough Rider Industries of Bismarck at the previous meeting for two attorney tables for the courtroom in the amount of \$1,452.00. Both requests total \$2,952.00, with 25% of the projects to be funded by the County if awarded the grant. The commission authorized Korgel to submit the CFIG application request for \$2,214.00; \$738.00 to be funded by the County.
